Subject: Seeking the Poultry Federation's Support for Ferret Legalization

Dear Mr Mattos,

Enclosed, please find our completed **Form FGC1** submitted to the California Fish and Game Commission, along with extensive supporting exhibits. Our petition requests an update to the classification of domestic ferrets (*Mustela putorius furo*)—ensuring they are recognized as what they truly are: fully domesticated animals, not wild or detrimental.

We are reaching out to you because **concerns about ferrets and poultry farming have historically been raised**, yet they lack factual basis. While the public may associate weasels with threats to poultry, **domestic ferrets are vastly different from their wild cousins**—just as domestic dogs differ from wolves. In the 48 states where ferrets are legal, including major agricultural regions such as Texas and the Midwest, **there has never been a reported case of ferrets harming commercial poultry operations**.
