Subject: Request for Support for Petition 2025-003 on Domestic Ferret Legalization

I am reaching out on behalf of LegalizeFerrets.org to seek your support for Petition 2025-003, which we have submitted to the California Fish and Game Commission. This petition challenges the current classification of domestic ferrets as restricted wildlife and requests their lawful recognition as domestic animals, as they are in 48 other states.

As an organization dedicated to supporting the success of animal welfare and sheltering professionals in California, your leadership and advocacy have been instrumental in shaping policies that protect animals and advance their humane treatment.
