Subject:	Seeking expert documentation regarding status of domestic ferrets

I am reaching out on behalf of **LegalizeFerrets.org**, an organization dedicated to correcting the outdated classification of ferrets in California.

We have submitted a **petition to the California Fish and Game Commission** to challenge the wrongful designation of ferrets as "wild and detrimental." Despite ferrets being domesticated for centuries— especially in the UK, where they have a well-documented history in pest control—California continues to treat them as if they are wild animals.

One of our biggest challenges is that **wildlife biologists lack experience with domestic ferrets**, as ferrets are not part of their field. - 2. Ferrets are not a wild or detrimental species, as there are no established feral populations in the UK or elsewhere.

We strongly believe that authoritative voices from the UK, where ferrets have been well-documented in domestic and working roles for centuries, could **significantly strengthen our case**. We would be grateful for any letter or statement you could provide, which we would submit as part of our legal petition.
